He reported that the single strategy set out how the ICR could do ter, where investment was needed and where additional activity was needed in ter to support the ICR's vision. The Board strongly supported the strategy as sented and the following points were made:  The strategy provided a clear sense of direction and was in line with other major cancer centres. The ICR's unique activity was its drug development.  A shorter version of the strategy was additionally needed, and would be available online.  The strategy needed to be underpinned by an implementation plan with milestones and relevant KPIs that set out how success would be measured in 5 years' time.  The importance of the relationship with the RM was emphasized, and the work on integrated diagnostics was an excellent example of integration.  The addition from the RM of 'Diagnose better and earlier' was supported.
